Greetings from the Parsonage!

The night before my wife, Kari, and I left for England, instead of packing, I was completely immersed in our upstairs closet. While looking for something—which I don't know if was ever found—I discovered that the floorboards were loose and below them sat nearly a century's worth of accumulation. In an inch of compact dust (I kid you not) were newspaper clippings (some in Swedish, others in English), sealed contact lenses, Disney princess stickers, buttons, pins, pencils, game pieces, collar tabs, and a lot of matches! Something from likely every pastor who has called the parsonage home fell through the cracks of the boards and joined the collection. It is so easy to forget that many walked this earth, worked your land, maybe even called your house home, before you—it is even easier to forget that there were humans who lost things through the cracks of the floor much like we do today—and yes, I did find something of mine embedded in the dust.

The closet was a wonderful object lesson in change, but also stewardship. After all, what is stewardship but stability through change. Every lost item comes from a different person inhabiting the same exact role. There have been seven pastors who called Svea's parsonage "home," I shudder to think of how many sermons have been written in the office, how many parishioners dropped in for coffee or conversation, and how many pets have roamed these halls—my cats are the cutest! As stewards of a congregation, we are all links in a chain that goes back to the first disciples of Christ. Two-thousand years of diligent care for the Gospel and God's called community. Sometimes we equate stewardship with ownership and imagine a permanent bond between us and some larger entity. Yet, stewardship has little to do with permanency. Stewardship is the temporary care of something that will long outlive us (and yes, temporary can even mean a lifetime). When we are done using land and resources or belonging to a congregation, they don't just up and disappear. God calls a new steward to care for them. This is an endless cycle that we are blessed to be a part of. Ownership is caring for something because it is ours; stewardship is caring because the item is God's.

Each believer is called to seek out other Christians and worship together as a community, but congregations that we build are never our own-they belong to God. None of the past-residents of the Svea parsonage ended their ministry here, they all eventually moved to serve elsewhere; the time and energy they gave to the congregation was replaced by another's. And although their role as a steward of the congregation was done, God was not done with the congregation. The parish continues to share the Gospel of Christ Jesus, just as all of our congregations do. Names on our membership roles come and go; there will be different pastors, councilmembers, musicians, but our parish will continue. Realizing our own role as stewards can take some of the pressure off of our lives. It is not all up to individuals or one family or one group to solve the congregation's problems. God is at work in our changing circumstances and is moving us not only to act but to prepare others to act in our absence. Just as faithful stewards of the earth are rewarded at harvest; faithful stewards of the church will be rewarded at the harvest to come.

Each generation leaves its mark on the congregation, or leaves something under the floor, but all should do so with the knowledge that another will someday rise up and leave their own.

Sunday, October 6th - 'God's Work-Our Hands-Day of Service' workday at the Eidsvold Cemetery after 10:30AM church service.

This event is open to ALL willing volunteers from both congregations that would like to participate. Also we really would like this to be the church's Youth Groups Fall clean up activity.

The main focus of this day's activity at the cemetery will be cleaning up any brush or weed growth that has grown around the perimeter of the fence line of the cemetery. This would be a great job for some strong young men and women to work on. We will also we working on cutting down and trimming around the headstones (IE: cut down old hostas and peonies and throw them in the ditch). Also stones need to be cleaned around as far as grass being swept away or trimmed away from the edges. Old stones will be pretreated with a solution so on that day we can go through with a scrub brush and bucket of water and/or power washer and clean and rinse them off.

Tools you can bring with that would be very helpful would be:

- ·Gloves, grass clippers, hedge trimmers, rakes, tarps, rags, brooms, scrub brushes, pails for water.
- ·Weed whips, gas power washers, leaf blowers

There will be a fire pit and we will have hot dogs and snacks for eating.
