



"The effects of cell phone use on adolescents mental health and what families can do about it"

NOW is the time to purchase school supplies for students in our community or Lutheran World Relief School Kits.

Local schools always appreciate donations of school supplies and are grateful to receive notebooks, glue, pens, erasers, crayons, colored pencils, markers, paper towels, Kleenex, and so on.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KITS: PROVIDE HOPE AND FUTURE TO CHILDREN AROUND THE WORLD.

The backpack bags are available at Eidsvold and Svea. They are in bundles of five school bags, but if you want less just take apart the bundles.

Items for SCHOOL KITS ARE: 4 spiral-wire bound notebooks (70-80 pages), one 30-centimeter ruler(12 inches) one pencil sharpener, one blunt scissors, 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers, 5 black or blue ballpoint pens(no gel ink), one box of Crayons (16-24 count) one 2 1/2 inch eraser

All items should be new, Remove all excess packaging. Send only the items listed--DO NOT ADD EXTRAS

PACKING INSTRUCTIONS: PLEASE DO NOT PUT NOTEBOOKS UPRIGHT-PLACE THE 4 NOTEBOOKS DOWN IN THE BOTTOM OF THE BAG ALTERNATING THE SPIRAL EDGES SO THEY LIE FLAT. PUT THE RULER BETWEEN 2 NOTEBOOKS AT AN ANGLE. Place other items toward the bottom of the bag and close the drawstring. Small rubber bands are available at each church for bundling pencils and pens.

Lutheran World Relief QUILTS. The quilts help children grow up to be strong and healthy. Stunting is caused by chronic malnutrition in a child's early years. Children who are stunted are more likely to get sick, take longer to get stronger and they often experience developmental delays and have trouble learning. Stunting is more than just being short; it prevents a child from reaching their potential. Researchers looked into the cause os stunting in Tanzania and discovered that children were not only hungry, they were cold. Instead of using every last calorie to grow, they were burning significant energy just to keep their bodies warm.

So thanks to all the quilters and the work of their hands--children in Tanzania have quilts to keep them warm and help them grow up strong and healthy!

In times of disaster, LWR immediately distributes quilts and kits to help our neighbors when they are exhausted, homeless, grieving, and terrified,. Thank you for sharing the love of Jesus with others through personal car kits, school kits, and quilts.
